POI #1: The Screaming Tunnel

The tunnel is known as "Screaming Tunnel" and was created in the early 1900s not as a thoroughfare but as a drainage passage to keep the tracks from being lost beneath flood waters. The fact that it allowed local farmers a convenient path to avoid the oncoming trains from the CNR overhead came only as a secondary use. Made from 125 feet of limestone bricks, the tunnel took on a haunted air early in its existence as moss and algae took hold of the porous stones. Given its eerie look, it is no wonder the simple tunnel became home to its own legend.

David Cronenberg created a psychic thriller in 1983 with his adaptation of the Steven King novel Dead Zone. Inthe movie, Christopher Walkens's character awakens after a head on colision and realizes he now had psychotic powers of reliving the past and foreseeing the future.



POI #3: Queenston Street, William Lyon MacKenzie Printing Press Then and Now

-1824 published weekly newspaper 'Colonial Advocate' (agricultural advice, poems, anecdeotes, advertising, current events...)

-CONFLICT!! -- criticism of the 'Family Compact' - the ruling families (mostly English - MacKenzie was Scottish), so... he left his store in Toronto, came to Queenston (the Queen's Town!!), as a publisher -1854 'Thirty years ago, I published at Queenston, on the 18th of May, 1824, The first number of a public newspaper, voluntarily



established to promote justice and equity in a sparsely populated, badly governed colony, To communicate the day that had transformed a quiet, peaceful obscure trade into an ardent colonial politician and public cause. I then planted in front of my dwelling a row of acacia or locust trees, And a grapevine and had the scene of seeing them grow luxuriously. Note: acacia has thorns ... democracy is a prickly pursuit!!!

POI #4: Brock's Horse Memorial



This horse carried General Sir Isaac Brock into battle at Detroit and Queenston Heights, is the most famous warhorse in Canadian history. Few know that, according to local legend, his final days were spent peacefully grazing on the grassy commons of the Goderich Square.


POI #5: Willowbank



Willowbank was the family home of Alexander Hamilton (1790-1839). He spent most of his life in Queenston, Ontario. Alexander was a businessman, militia officer, Justice of the Peace, Sheriff, Judge, and Postmaster. He had a lasting impact on the community and was important in the history of Upper Canada.

Alexander's father Robert Hamilton was a successful businessman and his mother Catherine was a member of the prominent Askin family. His wife, Hannah Owen Jarvis, was the daughter of the first provincial secretary and registrar of Upper Canada William Jarvis.

POI #6: 15608 Niagara Parkway Reif Winery "Ideal Country Home of Willis K Jackson"?

It was said that General Isaac Brock suggested that his English visitor travel to Gracewood. Upon arriving, the visitor was most impressed with the long laneway and rows of trees and roses lading up to the brick home. He wrote of this effect to the Irish poet, Thomas Moore, who in turn wrote 'The last Rose of Summer.

POI #7: McFarland House



Built in 1800 by John McFarland and his sons, on land granted to him by King George III, this is one of the few buildings in Niagara-on-the-Lake which pre-dates the War of 1812.

Used as a hospital and headquarters for both the British and American armies during the War of 1812.


It was also the location of a cannon battery created to protect the Niagara River Built on a ravine that was used as the launch point for the British attack on Fort Niagara in 1813.

The home is of particular historical significance as it survived the burning of Newark, a tragedy that took place when the American forces occupying Fort George retreated from the area in December 1813. This makes McFarland House one of the oldest structures in Niagara-on-the-Lake, as well as the oldest building owned by The Niagara Parks Commission.

POI #8: NOTL Pumphouse & Lighthouse







Original pumphouse water pump.

This one was driven by an internal combustion but the original was driven by a steam engine. Thus the pumphouse enclosed a boiler and 75' chimney.



This is the rear range light that was used to guide ships off of Lake Ontario and into the lower portion of the Niagara River. The lighthouse sits on the open grounds of 247 Ricardo Street. You can park in the lot and walk up to it, even though it is closed to the public.

its return trip.




Remains of the track that ended at the turntable in NOTL.
